## **Dual Enrollment Overview**

- Great Opportunity to be taken very seriously
- Remember, the Valencia College academic calendar is different than the OCPS academic calendar.
- Earn credits for high school and college simultaneously
- Classes, Books, Student ID, & Parking = FREE
- Beginning your College GPA DO YOUR BEST!
- Withdrawals can impact your college admission status, future financial aid and/or graduation status
- Must take 7 HIGH SCHOOL credits each school year

### What do you want out of Dual Enrollment?

- You must think about YOUR goal for dual enrollment (ex. As many credits paid for as possible, experience college courses prior to beginning, transition smoothly, interested in a certain course, or sequence)
- Scheduling Do you want to be on WHS's campus at all or full time? (full time is four classes or 13 credits classes per semester)
- Planning your class times (morning courses at WHS, etc.)
- Driving time 45 minute between Valencia and WHS courses
- Look ahead at University and major track of courses to help guide your course selection.

#### **Important Items to Discuss**

- Acceptance Letters
- Registering for Classes
  - Picking the right classes AND meeting high school graduation requirements
  - to have their Fall schedules finalized before the end of July to ensure that they receive funding for their textbooks.
- Books/Book Vouchers
  - Students will be notified up to 2 weeks before each semester starts stating that they will be able to purchase their textbooks and are then led to Valencia's where they will follow the instructions outlined.
  - Books and required material for course

- Refer to your Valencia ATLAS account AND Valencia ATLAS email for important information from Valencia Dual Enrollment.

### **Registering for Classes**

- When choosing classes:
  - Look at what you need to meet for Graduation Requirements: <u>https://www.fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/7764/urlt/standarddiplomarequirements.pdf</u>
  - Look at Valencia classes to see what will satisfy high school graduation requirements AS WELL AS earn your college credit.
    - You will want to take a look at colleges/universities that you would like to attend after high school graduation to see if the classes you take at Valencia will transfer.
  - Consult with your Guidance Counselor
    - Come to your Guidance Counselor with a plan on what you would like to take. This shows that you have done your research and are educated in the path you would like to pursue.
  - Valencia classes are scheduled by semester, where as Windermere classes are scheduled by year. (Example: English 3 at WHS <u>VERSUS</u> English Composition 1 at Valencia)
    - CLASSES MUST BE THE ENTIRE SEMESTER. NO MINI-MESTER OR FLEX CLASSES!!!

#### What Classes am I Allowed to Take

Based on your PERT scores:

• Math:

96 – College Mathematics or Introduction to Statistical Reasoning
114 – Intermediate Algebra (only half credit in high school)
123 – College Algebra

#### **Classes to Take Note of...**

- World History credit at high school requires TWO Valencia Courses: WHO 2012 and WHO 2022 (10th grade)
- US History credit at high school requires TWO Valencia courses: AMH2010 AND AMH2020. (11th grade)
- US Government credit is ONLY satisfied by POS2041, **NOT** the local and state Gov. class at Valencia (12th grade)
- ECO 1000 meets the requirement for high school required Economics credit. (12th grade)
- You need four credits of English to graduate, most DE students take English Honors 1 & English Honors 2 at Windermere and then, English Composition 1 and English Composition 2 at Valencia.
- SLS 1122 should only be completed if you are planning to receive your AA/AS degree from Valencia. The course is different at each Florida College


#### **Classes to Take Note of...**

- Science courses without a lab will count as a half credit on the high school side.
- Most electives count as a half credit on the high school side. Intermediate Algebra is only a half credit in high school, if you need a fourth math to graduate keep this in mind.
- Do not sign up for PE classes, classes that are less than 3 credits, or FLEX courses at Valencia.

## **Books & Book Vouchers for Fall**

#### Steps to receiving your Valencia Books:

- (Per Valencia) Students will be notified up to 2 weeks before each semester starts stating that they will be able to purchase their textbooks and are then led to our website where they will follow the instructions outlined.
- Fall schedules finalized before the end of July to ensure that they receive funding for their textbooks.
- If you miss the deadline, you will be responsible to purchase books without reimbursement.

#### **The Contract**

- I am required to communicate with my school counselor after registering for courses each semester to determine if the appropriate courses needed to meet OCPS high school graduation requirements have been selected.
- I am required to maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA (WHS) and a 2.0 Valencia GPA.
- I will check both my Windermere High School email and Valencia Atlas email daily.
- I must take 7 courses each year unless I qualify and am taking advantage of senior privilege. (English, Math, Science and Social Studies) Graduation requirements must be taken by Fall of senior year.
- I must upload a copy of my student detail schedule to the link above (I understand that I do not pay for tuition and books out-of-pocket).
- I understand that HOPE, Algebra I, Geometry (which are required to graduate from high school) cannot be taken at Valencia, UF, or UCF.

#### **The Contract Continued**

- I will read the ATLAS instructions for obtaining books and understand the protocol may change each semester. If I miss the opportunity for books within the semester, I understand I must purchase my own books with no reimbursement.
- I am required to return my books at the end of each semester to my counselor. Non-compliance will result in a book obligation on my account and non-issuance of a book voucher for the following term.
- Inform my guidance counselor if I plan to withdraw from a course (I understand that a "W" can potentially effect admission status, future financial aid and graduation status)
- I am required to provide my own transportation and be off campus when not enrolled in a Windermere course.
- ---- If I am under the age of 16 and attending Valencia, my parent/guardian must be present on campus.
  - Meet with an advisor to determine the appropriate courses needed to meet AA or AS degree requirements and register for an AA if completing prior to HS graduation.
  - If I am continuing at Valencia after HS graduation, I must change my status from Dual enrolled to Degree-Seeking student.

#### Things you need to know

- It is IMPORTANT that you inform your counselor about any grade concerns or if you have to drop/withdraw from a class before the add/drop and withdrawal period is over.
- SENIORS ALL graduation required course MUST be completed in the FALL of your senior year. You cannot take those courses in the Spring.
- AP English Lang and Test scores.
- There is not course recovery for DE courses if you do not pass the class
