## Electives

- Students will select a total of 6 electives choices.

- All students will be scheduled into one college \& career readiness class which will either be an AP, AICE, or DE core class OR a college \& career readiness elective.
- Please keep in mind that electives are offered based on student requests and class availability.

- If you choose the same elective multiple times, your counselor will choose your secondary elective choices for you.


## Foreign Language

- Students are strongly encouraged to take a Foreign language.
- It is not required for graduation but a minimum of 2-years of a language is required for acceptance in Florida colleges, Universilies, and Bright Futures.
- 3 years or more is recommended for University admission
